**Thursday, the 4th @ 3pm – Third Lake Brass Quintet** Founded in 2016, this collection of professional Madison-area brass musicians is dedicated to the performance of new and classic brass quintet repertoire. Their commitment to sharing this music with a broad audience and the generosity of the *Green Lake Festival of Music* has gotten them to Evergreen.

**Friday, the 5th @ 1pm – The Harp Music of Shari Sarazin** From ancient Celtic melodies to contemporary love ballads, this music will delight, intrigue and soothe you. Heavenly harp music along with inspiring vocals is a musical experience you don't want to miss!

**Tuesday, the 9th @ 3pm – Piano Concert by Brian Harris** Classically trained pianist Brian Harris will dazzle when his fingers touch the piano keys! His performance will include some vocals, with music ranging from classical, jazz and pop.

**Wednesday, the 17th @ 3pm – Digital Lecture – Leonard Bernstein: An American Musical Icon** Leonard Bernstein was just 25 years old when he burst onto the New York and international musical scene with one of the most famous debuts of all time: his substitution for the ailing Bruno Walter as conductor of the New York Philharmonic in November of 1943. This presentation places Bernstein's musical journey against the backdrop of American cultural history. We will trace his early years and see how he overcame numerous obstacles to a successful career.



**Friday, the 19th @ 2pm – Digital Performance – Cyrano de Bergerac** One of the most enduring love stories of all time, Edmond Rostand's *Cyrano de Bergerac* tells a tale of unrequited love. Wordsmith Cyrano is in love with Roxanne but because of his enormous nose, he is too afraid to woo her. Instead, he counsels handsome suitor Christian, using him as a mouthpiece for his poetic words until it's too late.

**Monday, the 22nd @ 3pm – Digital Lecture – Understanding Intelligence** What is intelligence? Is it a function of nature or nurture? Is it a single dimension, or does it include multiple distinct abilities? And how does it change over time? This class describes cutting-edge psychology and neuroscience research that addresses these and other fascinating questions. Professor Sanderson will end this presentation by describing the link between intelligence and creativity, and the evidence for Albert Einstein's view that "The true sign of intelligence is not knowledge, but imagination."

**Thursday, The 25th @ 3:00 pm—Travel Recap w/ Caitlyn** Come see pictures and hear stories from Caitlyn's 10 day trip to Ireland!
