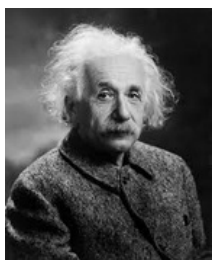
Monday, November 3rd at 7pm Performance by Fox Cities Swing Band
