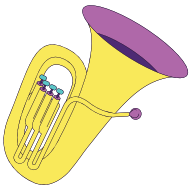

**Wednesday, April 15<sup>th</sup> at 3pm Digital Presentation: How Music Shapes the Brain**



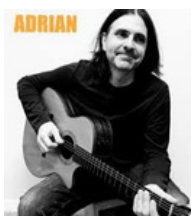

Once an unknown, Jimmy Carter rose from Georgia governor to the thirty-ninth president of the United States in 1976. The presenter examines how Carter's beliefs and style resonated with voters during a turbulent decade of economic challenges, political distrust, and rising conservatism. The lecture explores how he built broad support, yet ultimately could not maintain it, setting the stage for Ronald Reagan's 1980 victory.
